**Joseph Bouchard (D)**

Joseph Bouchard **supports a woman's right to choose** and believes politicians should not interfere in personal, private decisions.

Bouchard also supports commonsense policies that would **prevent unintended pregnancies** and reduce the need for abortion, such as:

- ◆ Increasing access to **affordable birth control** and emergency contraception; and
- ◆ Supporting medically accurate, **age appropriate sex education** in public schools.



**Chris Stolle (R)**

Stolle did not respond to NARAL Virginia's candidate questionnaire.

A mailpiece he sent out during his 2007 primary campaign said:  
"[Chris] will be a powerful voice for pro-life Virginians. Chris strongly supports proposals that will **further limit abortion in Virginia.**"

Asked in a debate if he **would vote to ban abortions in Virginia**, Stolle responded, "Yes, I would." (Jim Hoefft, Blog Talk Radio, 5/27/07)

Restrictions on choice at the national level mean we must work that much harder to keep choice safe and accessible in Virginia.
