William Day (D)

Bill Day **supports a woman's right to choose** and believes politicians should not interfere in personal, private decisions.

Day also supports commonsense policies that would **prevent unintended pregnancies** and reduce the need for abortion, such as:

- ◆ Increasing access to **affordable birth control** and emergency contraception; and
- ◆ Supporting medically accurate, **age appropriate sex education** in public schools.



Scott Lingamfelter (R)

Scott Lingamfelter wants to **outlaw abortion** and even some forms of contraception. (HB2797, 2007)

He supports legislation that would **force many of Virginia's clinics to close** due to overregulation. (HB1883, 2007)

He refuses to support legislation that would **prevent unintended pregnancy** and **reduce** the need for **abortion**. (HB2221, 2007; HB1414, 2004)

Restrictions on choice at the national level mean we must work that much harder to keep choice safe and accessible in Virginia.

The Virginia legislature has great power to restrict reproductive choice, and that's why this year, the bottom line is clear:
