Margaret Vanderhye **supports a woman's right to choose** and believes politicians should not interfere in personal, private decisions.

Vanderhye also supports commonsense policies that would **prevent unintended pregnancies** and reduce the need for abortion, such as:

- ◆ Increasing access to **affordable birth control** and emergency contraception; and
- ◆ Supporting medically accurate, **age appropriate sex education** in public schools.



David Hunt (R)

In a 2003 survey completed when he was running for State Senate, Dave Hunt wrote that he believes abortion should be **illegal in all cases except for when the life of the mother was threatened.**

He wrote that he **does not believe that abortion is a private matter** between a woman and her doctor.

He agreed to **oppose expanding access to emergency contraception** and to support measures that would **force many Virginia abortion providers** to close due to overregulation.

Restrictions on choice at the national level mean we must work that much harder to keep choice safe and accessible in Virginia.

The Virginia legislature has great power to restrict reproductive choice, and that's why this year, the bottom line is clear:
